- Question 2) Please reference the project special provisions for Item 151.25. Gravel Borrow for Backfilling Structures and Pipe Sewer. The special provision seems to include work required under multiple contract items, including excavation, trenching, disposal of excess materials etc. Is the intent of this item to compensate the contractor for the replacement of unsuitable material encountered during the installation of sewer structures and pipe? Additionally, this item includes the disposal of excess material is found to be contaminated will the contractor be compensated under the appropriate contaminated material item within the contract since that is the only fair and equitable way to compensate for a latent condition?
- Response 2) Replacement of unsuitable material encountered during the installation of sewer structures and pipe will be compensated with material under Item 156., excavation greater than 5 feet will be compensated under Items 142. and 144. Any contaminated materials encountered will be compensated under the appropriate contaminated material item.
