A.J. Virgilio Construction, Inc. e-mail dated October 10, 2025

- Question 3) Should there be a bid item for patching for use over the sewer trench in Highland Ave, or should it be incidental to bid item 250.08? The pavement items don't seem to include it based on the quantities and the basis of payment for bid item 250.08 does not mention it.
- Response 3) No bid item will be used for patching. The intent is to use gravel borrow to meet grade during the temporary condition. The final condition will fall under the full depth reconstruction.
- Question 4) Plan sheet 4, Construction Plan, shows a temporary edge of road on Highland Ave. What work is required for this and under which bid item should it be carried?
- Response 4) The intent is to use gravel borrow for the temporary access road to Highland Ave. which will allow vehicles to access their properties during construction of the bridge.
- Question 5) Bid item 853.23, Temporary Barrier, has a bid quantity of 54 FT, but inset B from Detour Plan (Sheet 9) shows a length of 143 FT. Please review quantity.
- Response 5) See revised page B00420 11.
- Question 6) Bid item 151.2, Gravel for Backfilling Structures and Pipes, has a bid quantity of 65 CY. Based on the detail on plan sheet 22, framing plan, that is showing with a hatched area where this material is being used, and the dimensions from the longitudinal section and the framing plan from the same plan sheet, the quantities of this material should be closer to 150 CY. Please review quantity.
- Response 6) The 65 CY is low because the intent is to re-use material from the structure excavation quantity.
- Question 7) Should there be a bid item for Gravel borrow for bridge foundations? If not, under which item should this be included?
- Response 7) Item 151.1 has been added. See revised page B00420 4.

- Question 8) Could a plan view layout be provided for the rebar in the pile cap? The only information I can see is on plan sheet 20, which is a section through the pile cap. It shows the rebar, but does not indicate bar size or spacing. Also, since the footing is not of a uniform shape, a layout would be helpful.
- Response 8) On Sheet No. 20, "Typical Section Through Pile Cap" detail, the reinforcing steel should be #5 @ 6" transverse bottom bar, #5 @ 12" transverse top bar and #5 @ 12" longitudinal bar at each face. Official Plan changes will be made at a later date.

- Question 9) Please check your quantity for sub bid item 910.1, steel reinforcement for structures, epoxy coated. The bid quantity seems too small.
- Response 9) See revised page A00801-169.
- Question 10) Please indicate where we should expect to encounter Asbestos for items 182.1 and 182.2. One of our Asbestos removal contractors went to visit the site and saw nothing that might be suspect for asbestos. There doesn't seem to be any piping or conduit around or beneath the bridge at all. Are we missing something?
- Response 10) We believe the only locations for asbestos to be in the joints of the bridge or in the replaced sewer line. However, we don't have confirmation that this will be the case. The quantity is expected to be small.

- Question 11) Please confirm that the furnishing and installation of the 'Controlled Density Fill (Non-Excavatable)' required around the base of the precast guardrail transitions will be compensated under Item # 160.3.
- Response 11) Confirmed.

- Question 12) Please clarify the intent of pay item 691. Balance Stone Wall Removed and Rebuilt. Per the detail on plan sheet 30 it appears that the only work required under this item is to repoint the existing stone masonry walls to remain. If so, please confirm that no portions of the stone wall are to be removed and rebuilt, and confirm that the Contractor will be compensated, per foot, of masonry joint that is repointed.
- Response 12) Item 691 Balanced Stone Wall has been replaced with Item 685 -Stone Masonry Wall in Cement Mortar. On Sheet No. 30, "Keyup Brook Existing North Wall Elevation" detail, the hatched area that is labeled as 50 SF of Masonry Repointing Area will now have the stones removed and a new wall rebuilt. The new quantity will be 10 CY. See revised page B00420 9. Official Plan changes will be made at a later date.
- Question 13) Per the demolition elevation views on plan sheet 19, small portions of the existing masonry retaining walls will require reconstruction. Under what pay item will this work be measured/ compensated?
- Response 13) The small portions of the existing masonry retaining walls are to be paid under added Item, Item No. 685 Stone Masonry Wall in Cement Mortar. The quantity will be 10 CY. See revised page B00420 9.
- Question 14) Please confirm the type of concrete material that is required to be installed on the concrete sloping between the existing and proposed abutments. Per the 'Concrete Mix' notes on plan sheet 15 the material for the concrete slope is called out to be 5,000 psi, 3/8", 710 HP cement concrete. Referencing the special provisions for Item 901.2 Shotcrete Channel Slope states that the shotcrete shall confirm to subsection M4.06.12 of the standard specifications, there is no M4.06.12 in the standard specifications.
- Response 14) See Standard Specifications 2025, Division III, Section M4: Cement Concrete and Related Materials, M4.06.12: Shotcrette (page III.111).
- Question 15) Please confirm that removal of the existing 8" PVC sewer line is incidental to Item # 250.08.
- Response 15) Confirmed.

- Question 16) Please clarify the required thickness of the modified rockfill that is to be installed within the brook. The 'Modified Rockfill Section View' on plan sheet 12 has a dimension of 24" and a label of 15" modified rock fill. Referencing the channel sections on plan sheet 31, the depth of streambed material is shown to be 3'-0" thick.
- Response 16) The Channel Longitudinal and Transverse Sections on Sheet 31 depicts the depth of streambed improvements correctly at 3 feet. Please disregard the Modified Rockfill Section View on Sheet 12. Official Plan changes will be made at a later date.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

PRICE ADJUSTMENTS FOR STRUCTURAL STEEL AND REINFORCING STEEL

September 17, 2025

This special provision applies to all projects containing the use of structural steel and/or reinforcing steel as specified elsewhere in the Contract work. It applies to all structural steel and all reinforcing steel, as defined below, on the project. Compliance with this provision is mandatory, i.e., there are no "opt-in" or "opt-out" clauses. Price adjustments will be handled as described below and shall only apply to unfabricated reinforcing steel bars and unfabricated structural steel material, consisting of rolled shapes, plate steel, sheet piling, pipe piles, steel castings and steel forgings.

Price adjustments will be variances between Base Prices and Period Prices. Base Prices and Period Prices are defined below.

Price adjustments will only be made if the variances between Base Prices and Period Prices are 5% or more. A variance can result in the Period Price being either higher or lower than the Base Price. Once the 5% threshold has been achieved, the adjustment will apply to the full variance between the Base Price and the Period Price.

Price adjustments will be calculated by multiplying the number of pounds of unfabricated structural steel material or unfabricated reinforcing steel bars on a project by the index factor calculated as shown below under <u>Example of a</u> Period Price Calculation.

Price adjustments will <u>not</u> include guardrail panels or the costs of shop drawing preparation, handling, fabrication, coatings, transportation, storage, installation, profit, overhead, fuel costs, fuel surcharges, or other such charges not related to the cost of the unfabricated structural steel and unfabricated reinforcing steel.

The weight of steel subject to a price adjustment shall not exceed the final shipping weight of the fabricated part by more than 10%.

Base Prices and Period Prices are defined as follows:

<u>Base Prices</u> of unfabricated structural steel and unfabricated reinforcing steel on a project are fixed prices determined by the Department and found in the table below. While it is the intention of the Department to make this table comprehensive, some of a project's unfabricated structural steel and/or unfabricated reinforcing steel may be inadvertently omitted. Should this occur, the Contractor shall bring the omission to the Department's attention so that a contract alteration may be processed that adds the missing steel to the table and its price adjustments to the Contract.

The Base Price Date is the month and year of the most recent finalized period price index at the time that MassDOT opened bids for the project. The Base Price Index for this contract is the Steel PPI listed in the Notice to Contractors.

<u>Period Prices</u> of unfabricated structural steel and unfabricated reinforcing steel on a project are variable prices that have been calculated using the Period Price Date and an index of steel prices to adjust the Base Price.

The Period Price Date is the date the steel was delivered to the fabricator as evidenced by an official bill of lading submitted to the Department containing a description of the shipped materials, weights of the shipped materials and the date of shipment. This date is used to select the Period Price Index.

The index used for the calculation of Period Prices is the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics Producer Price Index (PPI) Series ID WPU101702 (Not Seasonally Adjusted, Group: Metals and Metal Products, Item: Semi-finished Steel Mill Products.) As this index is subject to revision for a period of up to four (4) months after its original publication, no price adjustments will be made until the index for the period is finalized, i.e., the index is no longer suffixed with a "(P)".

Period Prices are determined as follows:

Period Price = Base Price X Index Factor Index Factor = Period Price Index / Base Price Index

Example of a Period Price Calculation:

Calculate the Period Price for December 2009 using a Base Price from March 2009 of \$0.82/Pound for 1,000 Pounds of ASTM A709 (AASHTO M270) Grade A36 Structural Steel Plate.

The Period Price Date is December 2009. From the PPI website*, the Period Price Index = 218.0.

The Base Price Date is March 2009. From the PPI website*, the Base Price Index = 229.4.

Index Factor = Period Price Index / Base Price Index = 218.0 / 229.4 = 0.950 Period Price = Base Price X Index Factor = \$0.82/Pound X 0.950 = \$0.78/Pound

Since \$0.82 - \$0.78 = \$0.04 is less than 5% of \$0.82, no price adjustment is required.

If the \$0.04 difference shown above was greater than 5% of the Base Price, then the price adjustment would be 1,000 Pounds X \$0.04/Pound = \$40.00. Since the Period Price of \$0.78/Pound is less than the Base Price of \$0.82/Pound, indicating a drop in the price of steel between the bid and the delivery of material, a credit of \$40.00 would be owed to MassDOT. When the Period Price is higher than the Base Price, the price adjustment is owed to the Contractor.

End of example.

The Contractor will be paid for unfabricated structural steel and unfabricated reinforcing steel under the respective contract pay items for all components constructed of either structural steel or reinforced Portland cement concrete under their respective Contract Pay Items.

Price adjustments, as herein provided for, will be paid separately as follows:

Structural Steel

Pay Item Number 999.449 for positive (+) pay adjustments (payments to the Contractor)

Pay Item Number 999.457 for negative (-) pay adjustments (credits to MassDOT Highway Division)

Reinforcing Steel

Pay Item Number 999.466 for positive (+) pay adjustments (payments to the Contractor)

Pay Item Number 999.467 for negative (-) pay adjustments (credits to MassDOT Highway Division)

No price adjustment will be made for price changes after the Contract Completion Date, unless the MassDOT Highway Division has approved an extension of Contract Time for the Contract.

determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical

order under rate identifiers indicating whether the particular

rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate), a survey

rate, a weighted union average rate, a state adopted rate, or a

supplemental classification rate.

Union Rate Identifiers

A four-letter identifier beginning with characters other than

""SU"", ""UAVG"", ?SA?, or ?SC? denotes that a union rate was

prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2024. PLUM is an identifier of the union whose collectively bargained rate prevailed in the survey for

this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers.

0198 indicates the local union number or district council

number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next

number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2024 in the

example, is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all changes

over time that are reported to WHD in the rates in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing the classification.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

The UAVG identifier indicates that no single rate prevailed for

those classifications, but that 100% of the data reported for

the classifications reflected union rates. EXAMPLE: ${\tt UAVG-OH-0010~01/2024}$. ${\tt UAVG}$ indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the State of Ohio.

The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 01/01/2024

in the example, indicates the date the wage determination was

updated to reflect the most current union average rate.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January, to

reflect a weighted average of the current rates in the collective bargaining agreements on which the rate is based.

Survey Rate Identifiers

The ""SU"" identifier indicates that either a single non-union

rate prevailed (as defined in 29 CFR 1.2) for this classification in the survey or that the rate was derived by

computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates

reported in the survey for that classification. As a weighted

average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may

include both union and non-union rates. Example: SUFL2022-007

6/27/2024. SU indicates the rate is a single non-union prevailing rate or a weighted average of survey data for that

classification. FL indicates the State of Florida. 2022 is the

year of the survey on which these classifications and rates are

based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 6/27/2024 in the example, indicates the survey completion date

for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

?SU? wage rates typically remain in effect until a new survey

is conducted. However, the Wage and Hour Division (WHD) has the

discretion to update such rates under 29 CFR 1.6(c)(1).

this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers.

0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next

number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2024 in the

example, is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all changes

over time that are reported to WHD in the rates in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing the classification.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

The UAVG identifier indicates that no single rate prevailed for

those classifications, but that 100% of the data reported for

the classifications reflected union rates. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 01/01/2024. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the State of Ohio.

The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 01/01/2024

in the example, indicates the date the wage determination was

updated to reflect the most current union average rate.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January, to

reflect a weighted average of the current rates in the

collective bargaining agreements on which the rate is based.

Survey Rate Identifiers

The ""SU"" identifier indicates that either a single non-

rate prevailed (as defined in 29 CFR 1.2) for this classification in the survey or that the rate was derived by

computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As a weighted

average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may

include both union and non-union rates. Example: SUFL2022-007

6/27/2024. SU indicates the rate is a single non-union prevailing rate or a weighted average of survey data for that

classification. FL indicates the State of Florida. 2022 is the

year of the survey on which these classifications and rates are

based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 6/27/2024 in the example, indicates the survey completion date

for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

?SU? wage rates typically remain in effect until a new survey

is conducted. However, the Wage and Hour Division (WHD) has

discretion to update such rates under 29 CFR 1.6(c)(1).

State Adopted Rate Identifiers

The ""SA"" identifier indicates that the classifications

prevailing wage rates set by a state (or local) government were

adopted under 29 C.F.R 1.3(g)-(h). Example: SAME2023-007 01/03/2024. SA reflects that the rates are state adopted. ME

refers to the State of Maine. 2023 is the year during which the

state completed the survey on which the listed classifications

and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an

internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 01/03/2024 in the example, reflects the date on which

the classifications and rates under the ?SA? identifier took

effect under state law in the state from which the rates were adopted.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- a) a survey underlying a wage determination
- b) an existing published wage determination
- c) an initial WHD letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- d) an initial conformance (additional classification and rate) determination

The work under this heading shall conform to the applicable provisions of Subsection 970 of the Standard Specifications.

Shall be used on concrete walls of the precast three-sided concrete frame.

METAL BRIDGE RAILING (3 RAIL), STEEL (TYPE S3-TL4)

The work under this heading shall conform to the applicable provisions of Subsection 975 of the Standard Specifications.

The Type S3-TL4 steel bridge railing shall be furnished and installed in accordance with the plans and specifications.

SCHEDULE OF BASIS FOR PARTIAL PAYMENT

Within ten (10) days after Notice to Proceed, the Contractor shall submit on his/her proposal form a schedule of unit prices for the major component Sub-Items that make up Item 995.01 as well as his/her total bridge structure Lump Sum cost for Bridge Structure No. E-10-011 (CLV). The bridge structure Lump Sum breakdown quantities provided in the proposal form are estimated and not guaranteed. The total of all partial payments to the Contractor shall equal the Lump Sum Contract price regardless of the accuracy of quantities furnished by the Engineer for the individual bridge components. The cost of labor and materials for any Item not listed but required to complete the work shall be considered incidental to Item 995.01 and no further compensation will be allowed.

The schedule on the proposal form applies only to Bridge Structure No. E-10-011(CLV). Payment for similar materials and construction at locations other than at this bridge structure shall not be included under this Item. Sub-Item numbering is presented for information only in coordination with MassDOT Standard Nomenclature.
